Born on 1 November 1980 and 21 February 1983 in Chennai, Tamil Nadu, respectively, Shri Srikrishna Mohan and Shri Ramkumar Mohan received their initial training in Carnatic vocal music from Shrimati Balamani Eswar and Shri Thamarakkadu Govindan Namboothiri. Later, they received advanced training under the tutelage of Shri Neyyattinkara Mohanachandran and Shri P.S. Narayanaswami.

Shri Srikrishna Mohan and Shri Ramkumar Mohan, also known as the Trichur Brothers, have performed in many prestigious music festivals in India and abroad. They have composed and rendered the “Namami Gange” song that was adopted by the Government of India for the Namami Gange campaign.
