Akademi Award: Carnatic Instrumental Music (Violin)

Born in 1924 in Mylapore, Tamil Nadu, Shri Mylapore Sundaramiyer Anantharaman is the son and disciple of Shri Parur A. Sundaram Iyer. Besides the violin, he received training in the Veena and in Hindustani music.

Shri Mylapore Anantharaman is an eminent violinist in the field of Carnatic music. Besides giving solo concerts he has accompanied many renowned musicians in their performances in India and abroad. A reputed teacher of the art, he served the Tamil Nadu Government Music College as Professor of Violin from 1962 to 1983. Subsequently, he taught at Pittsburgh in the United States for some time.

Shri Anantharaman has been honoured with the title Kalaimamani by the Tamil Nadu Eyal Isai Nataka Manram and has received the T.T.K. Memorial Award of the Music Academy, Madras, apart from felicitations given by various arts organizations. He has had the honour of being Asthana Vidwan of the Kanchi Kamakoti Peetam.
